MISSION STATEMENT

Saint John Paul II Academy offers a holistic, mission-driven education shaped by the Catholic and Lasallian values of faith, respect, and service. Our graduates leave prepared to make a positive impact through lives of character, compassion, and thoughtful leadership.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

- Saint John Paul II Academy opened in 1980 as Pope John Paul II High School administered by the Carmelite Brothers and Adrian Dominican sisters. In 2012, after their departure, our school was accepted as an official ministry of the Brothers of the Christian Schools (Lasallian). Our school name changed to Saint John Paul II Academy in 2015 and continues to follow the Lasallian tradition.
- The only Lasallian high school in Florida and a member of the DENA Lasallian network of 54 schools.
- Our student population is composed of 46% females and 54% males.
- Total enrollment for 2026 - 2027 is 556 students with a 13:1 Student to Teacher Ratio.
- Tuition ranges from \$18,975 - \$20,000, depending upon grade level. Step Up is offered for financial assistance.
- Our professional faculty consists of one Roman Catholic priest and 45 laypeople.
- The school calendar is divided into two semesters and includes four grading periods. Seven daily classes of 45 minutes meet five times per week on a rotating basis.
- 105 courses are offered in 9 different disciplines.

ACADEMICS

Saint John Paul II Academy offers classes of a variety of levels, including:

- 35 Honors courses
- 18 Advanced Placement Courses
- 6 Dual Enrollment Courses

- The De La Salle Scholars Program is a highly selective program of study for students who demonstrate exceptional achievement in the areas of academics, leadership, and service in accordance with the Lasallian tradition.
- The program challenges students to explore complex questions across the humanities, science, and ethics.
- AP Seminar (junior year) and AP Research (senior year): students engage in discussion-based learning, advanced research, and the development of an original thesis. Upon successful completion, students may be eligible to earn a Certificate of Research.
- Scholars participate in cultural experiences, academic forums, and service opportunities that extend learning beyond the classroom.
