

LYNN UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP

Lynn University is offering a SCHOLARSHIP to one Saint John Paul II Academy graduate. This scholarship is for full tuition (it does not cover room and board, books or any other university fees). The scholarship is renewable each year for four years. This is not athletic or an academic scholarship.

The Scholarship is awarded to a student who meets the following requirements.

- 1. Has been accepted to Lynn University as a full time student.
- 2. Has a financial need for scholarship.
- 3. Exhibits exemplary ideals of school spirit, involvement and leadership.
- 4. Has made the philosophy and goals of SJPII part of their personal value system/creed.
- 5. Academic grade point average is 3.0.
- 6. Met Saint John Paul II Academy Service requirements each year.
- 7. Extracurricular participation.
- 8. Continues to maintain at least a 3.0 academic grade point average and participate in extracurricular programs while at Lynn University.

Each student who wishes to be considered for this scholarship must show proof of financial need for the scholarship. The best way to do this is to submit a copy of **2021** tax forms or 2021 FAFSA results. In addition, each student who wishes to apply must list all of the school activities he/she has participated in over the course of studies here at SJPII Academy. In a well-written essay, each student is asked to explain how he/she lives the philosophy and goals of SJPII Academy. We are especially interested in knowing how the time spent at SJPII Academy has aided the student in forming a value system that is in line with our philosophy. Include examples of leadership, generosity of spirit and how the school's motto, "Founded on Jesus Christ" can be used to describe your personal value system and life.

Students are welcome to include letters of recommendation with the application package.

Deadline to turn in all paperwork into the Guidance Office is March 3, 2023

The recipient will be chosen by a SJPII Academy Scholarship Review Committee.
