## Drug & Alcohol Use By Students In Modern Society

All of us at Saint John Paul II Academy understand that there are pressures in modern society that lead young people to consider the use of illicit substances in their social life. We know that these pressures can lead students to use a variety of substances that are inappropriate physically, psychologically,

emotionally, developmentally, and spiritually. Knowing this, and knowing that the availability of illicit substances ranging from alcohol to both illegal and prescription drugs has become far easier than in years past, we have worked with parents, students, and alumni in examining

strategies to assist students in not only dealing with the pressures that teens face regarding drug and alcohol use but also by educating them about the inherent dangers of these substances, particularly at their level of physical, emotional, social, and spiritual development.

## What We Believe - Illicit/Illegal Drugs

We believe that

illicit drugs.

- We believe that students learn best when they are not suffering from the direct influence of drug and/or alcohol abuse.
- We believe that the use of illicit drugs is never acceptable and that adolescents do not have the privilege to engage in illicit drug and/or alcohol use.
- We believe that the use of illicit drugs, even controlled substances that may be legal in some states, is not acceptable for students at Saint John Paul II Academy.
- We believe that it is never appropriate for students to possess or use illicit drugs.
- We believe that

possession/use of illicit drugs by adolescents is not only illegal but that it can lead to serious legal issues impacting their futures and that it can negatively impact their developmental and academic progress as well as their physical, social, emotional, and spiritual health.

#### What We Believe—Alcohol

- We believe that students learn best when they are not suffering from the direct influence of alcohol abuse. We further believe that any use of alcohol by young people under the age of 21 is, by definition, alcohol abuse.
- We believe that responsible alcohol use is a privilege and not a right, and that the only appropriate time to

- consume alcohol begins at the age of 21.
- We believe that it is never appropriate for students to possess or use alcohol.
- We believe that it is never appropriate for parents to turn a blind eye towards alcohol consumption in their homes and that those who do so may be at risk of both violating the
- laws of the State of Florida and of subjecting themselves to potential significant civil liability.
- We believe that possession/use of alcohol by adolescents is not only illegal but that it can lead to serious legal issues impacting their futures and that it can negatively impact their academic and developmental progress.

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# **Drug Testing: Helping Students Make Good Choices**

After carefully analyzing the positive results of drug testing programs in a variety of schools nationwide, Saint John Paul II Academy has decided to implements a mandatory, random drug testing policy as an enhancement to the School's continuing educational and prevention initiatives and disciplinary policies. While we believe that our students fall significantly below the national averages for high school drug use, and while multiple 'sweeps' of areas of our property by law enforcement officers with dogs trained to detect illegal drugs have failed to find any evidence of their presence on campus, we want to do all that we can to help secure the well-being of the young men and women entrusted to our care. Research shows that

drug testing is a powerful deterrent to drug use.

The primary purpose of this policy is to give our students another reason to say 'no' to drugs and alcohol and to assist them in living and maintaining a substance-free lifestyle.

As a Catholic school we believe that we have a unique advantage in our ability to offer this program. We believe that this is a proactive step towards preventing problems, and that should any positive results be uncovered that parents would be empowered to assist their children in finding the help that is needed.

#### Nationally.....

- 33% of high school students use marijuana.
- 80% of high school students report witnessing illegal drug use, possession, or dealing of drugs.
- 72% Of high school students with B to A averages do not use marijuana.

## **How Does Drug Testing Work?**

Students will be tested by hair analysis, a process that requires a small cosmetically insignificant sample of hair from the student. This method was chosen because it has consistently proven to be the most effective method in correctly identifying drug use while being the least invasive and most cost-effective technique. The hair sample is secured in a bag and the student will sign the bag to insure that the contents are their own.

The test will screen for marijuana (THC), cocaine, opiates, amphetamines (including ecstasy and methamphetamines), and phencyclidine (PCP). Additionally, the test may identify a range of usage levels (light, moderate, heavy) and it also can provide a time window for the use of the substance.

Students will be randomly selected for testing throughout the year (August through May). Once a student is tested, his or her name is returned to the collective pool and he or she may be selected again.

When a student tests negative a letter will be sent to the parents/guardians confirming that great news.

For students whose test result yield a positive for some drug/alcohol use, the following will occur:

- Students and parents will be given the information from the analysis report in a meeting with the Guidance Counselor and Assistant Principal for Student Life.
- There will be no disciplinary consequences nor will there be any restriction on cocurricular participation for the first positive result from testing under the 'Health & Wellness' policy focus.
- Disciplinary and cocurricular consequences will be imposed for violations of the "Student & Campus Safety" policy focus. Note that routine alcohol testing falls within this "Student & Campus Safety" policy focus
- A mandatory retest, between 90 and 120 days from the first test, will be done (at the parents' expense).

Should a student test positive a second time, the Principal will be informed and the student's future at SJPII Academy would need to be discussed with the student and parents.
